

Policy Board Committee Responsibilities

Been thinking about getting more involved? Here is a way.

Individual Committee Members Charge (All Policy Committees)

- Understand MUCC Policies and representing them in various forums, including external advisory committees you might serve on.
- Participate in your committee meetings in person whenever possible. Via email or other electronic method if you cannot attend in person.
- Attend training when offered.
- Policy Committees will meet (at a minimum) at the beginning of each policy board meeting. More meetings may be called by the committee chair on an as need basis.

Fisheries Committee Charge

- Assist in the implementation of existing MUCC fisheries, water protection, Great Lakes restoration, and aquatic invasive species policies
- Identify state policy needs and develop or refine MUCC's fisheries policies, including providing comments on proposed fisheries resolution.
- Assist staff in monitoring the implementation of the DNR's 2018-2022
- Fisheries Division Strategic Plan.
- Monitor public engagement processes (NRC and DNR Committees etc.) on fisheries and aquatic habitat issues and comments on their effectiveness.
- Should have diverse representation both geographically and by specific Angler/aquatic resource interests, committee should help recruit people to fill open positions accordingly.
- Identify individuals or groups worthy of MUCC recognition.



Wildlife Committee Charge

- Assist in the implementation of existing MUCC wildlife, hunting and trapping,
 habitat and forest management policies.
- Identify state policy needs and develop or refine MUCC's policies, including providing comments on proposed wildlife resolutions.
- Assist staff in monitoring the implementation of the DNR's 2021-2026 Guiding Principals and Strategies-Wildlife Division's Strategic Plan.
- Monitor public engagement processes (NRC and DNR Committees, etc.) on wildlife and forestry issues and comment on their effectiveness.
- Should have diverse representation both geographically and by specific wildlife/forestry/habitat/method of take interests, the committee should help recruit people to fill open positions accordingly.

Firearms, Sport Shooting and Ranges Committee Charge

- Assist in the implementation of existing MUCC's sport shooting range and 2nd Amendment policies.
- Identify state policy needs and develop or refine MUCC's policies, including providing comments on proposed sport shooting range and firearms policies.
- Monitor public engagement processes related to sport shooting ranges and firearms.
- Identify educational needs of MUCC members related to sporting shooting ranges.
- Identify individuals or groups worthy of MUCC recognition.
- The Committee should have diverse representation geographically and should recruit members accordingly









Parks and Recreation & Trails Committee Charge



- Assist in the implementation of existing MUCC policy for parks, recreation, and trails.
- Identify states policy needs and develop or refine MUCC's policies, including providing comments on proposed resolutions.
- Monitor Parks and Recreation Strategic plans and comment on their effectiveness.
- Assist staff in monitoring the implementation of the DNR 2017-2022 parks and recreation strategic plan.
- The Committee should have diverse representation geographically and should recruit members accordingly

Youth and Education Committee Charge

- Monitor and assist with Michigan Hunter Education Program implementation and changes to help to ensure the highest quality opportunities possible
- Receive and review regular reports on DNR license sales data.
- Examine trends in recruitment, retention and reactivation (R3) and consider policies to reduce barriers and or expand opportunities for new or returning hunters, trappers angles, and recreation shooters.
- Seek to sustain and improve recreational safety education programs and look for opportunities to expand MUCC's outreach and educational initiatives.
- Understand MUCC's educational curriculum and programming Provide feedback on new and expanded opportunities.

Dowagiac Slopy Joes

2 lb. Hamburger (80%) lean gives best flavor. Skim fat before you serve if you want, or use a good slotted spoon.

1 green pepper

1 onion

1 cup catsup

2 T mustard (like French's)

2 T white sugar

1 T cider vinegar

1/2 tsp salt

1/4 tsp ground cloves (critical ingredient)

Chop the veg, throw everything in a pot and cook 20 min stirring often.

There you have it, no special ingredients, ready to eat in half an hour, delicious.
