November 9,1937

Harry Gaines of Grand Rapids, Presiding

Mr. Gaines opened the first meeting of the Michigan United Conservation Clubs with a request that each club represented announce its name and location.

He thanked the clubs for attending, stating that he could see no reason for clubs not affiliating as a state organization in the same manner that individuals affiliated in a small club. He said that purpose of organization was for cooperation with state department of conservation and for the good of conservation in general. He urged the clubs not to permit small petty grievances to interfere with the proper function of organization, that they keep an open mind, with candid open discussion at all times and not allow arguments to break up the organization. Majority should count at all times as just and right. Small local problems should ot interfere with progress of the state organization, but should be thrashed out in the local club.

Legislature By Nick Green

An 11-bill gun control package has been introduced in the Michigan Senate, and a hearing is expected later this week. Senate Bills 76-80 and 83-86 would institute universal background checks on firearms in Michigan, mandate home storage requirements and create a "red flag law" in the state.

Senate Bills 81-82 create a sales tax exemption on gun safety devices and MUCC supports these two bills as separate standalone legislation.

MUCC Executive Director Amy Trotter released the following statement in response to the legislation:

Michigan United Conservation Clubs grassroots, member-driven policy supports enforcing existing firearm laws and opposes new regulations on our members who are responsible, legal gun owners. Our membership consists of thousands of hunters, anglers, trappers and shooters. Many of our affiliate clubs and members are active in recreational shooting sports where many of our clubs operate firearm ranges.

Federal excise taxes on firearms and ammunition fuel wildlife conservation in Michigan and nationwide. As a leader in Michigan's conservation circles, we certainly encourage, educate and promote firearm safety in all that we do in the outdoors and beyond. MUCC supports enforcing existing gun laws and the brave men and women in law enforcement who enforce them.

MUCC believes these proposals infringe on the rights of lawful firearm owners within our membership.

MUCC will be at the committee hearing and testifying in opposition to the gun control package.

Great Lakes Consent Decree

A federal judge has scheduled oral arguments on objections and responses to the Proposed Consent Decree for May 24. Michigan United Conservation Clubs is a Coalition to Protect Michigan Resources member – a collection of conservation and angling organizations fighting to keep gill net expansion from harming our Great Lakes fisheries.

The State of Michigan_reversed its stance on decades-long management strategies related to gill nets and agreed to expansion in popular recreation areas in a proposed decree that was submitted to the court on December 11, 2022.
