Our History, a Snapshot in Time Continued

- 1977: Campaigned for ban on PCB's (toxic industrial compounds) in Michigan waters
- 1978: Began Tracks Magazine, a student reader focusing on Great Lakes wildlife used across the nation.
- 1979: Started MUCC Wildlife Discovery Programs in Michigan schools.
- 1979: Supported wetland protection legislation for Michigan
- 1980: Participated in development of Pigeon River Country State Forest Hydrocarbon Agreement.
- 1984: Supported and campaigned for ban on year-round shipping on the Great Lakes.
- 1984: Supported controlled elk hunts in Pigeon River Country State Forest.
- 1986: Campaigned for wine cooler bottle deposit law in Michigan.
- 1987: Provided radio collars for Moose Lift II Program in Michigan's Upper Peninsula.
- 1988: Initiated "Wildlife Encounters" Program for 1st-12th graders & adults.
- 1989: Campaigned for Recreational Cleanup Bond in Michigan.
- 1988-1989: Supported Combined Sewer Overflow Program to protect Michigan water quality.


What was the year?

If your answers all were the same year, you were correct.


Conservations Pledge

What's Cookin?

Parmesan Crusted Panfish





Ingredients: 1/4 cup butter, melted

1/2 cup of dried bread crumbs

1/3 cup grated Parmesan cheese

2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon paprika

1/4 teaspoon oregano

1/4 teaspoon pepper

1 pound bluegill

Instructions: Place butter in a shallow bowl. In another shallow bowl, combine the bread crumbs, cheese and seasoning. Dip fish in butter, then coat with crumbs mixture.

Place in a greased 15x10x1in.baking pan. Bake, uncovered at 350 deg. For 20 minutes or until fish flakes easily with fork.

Side Note: Perch or crappie ay be substituted for the bluegill.

OTG

With the 2021 field season behind us, MUCC's award-winning On the Ground (OTG) program is already planning projects for the 2022 season and working with biologists to determine how the program can have tangible impacts on public lands throughout Michigan.

In 2021, more than 200 volunteers impacted 141 acres of wildlife habitat through 821 volunteer hours. Volunteers joined us across the Lower Peninsula and in the Upper Peninsula to build rabbitat, plant native trees and wildflowers, and remove invasive flora.

Fort Custer State Recreation Area is a 3,033-acre park located between Battle Creek and Kalamazoo. The park features three lakes, the Kalamazoo River, a modern and equestrian campground, a swimming beach, more than 40 miles of trails, paddling and fishing opportunities, and much more.
